

Call for Articles! | Deadline: January 31, 2023 Focus: The Ukraine War and Sanctions at One Year

Dear Members:

The ILS is now accepting articles for publication in the Section's tenth issue of its International Newsletter, which is scheduled to be published in February-March 2023.

For this issue, which will publish just after the first anniversary of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, we are examining the **impact of the war in Ukraine and the sanctions regimes against Russia**. We are seeking articles of any relevance to this topic, including, but not limited to its impact on Texas business and legal communities.

The war and sanctions has directly impacted the Texas business and legal communities. Any topic related to international legal issues will be considered, but we would like to include articles related to the following topics:

- 1. The impact of the war and resulting legal changes to Texas businesses and individuals.
- 2. The international legal regimes relevant to wars and their application to Russia's invasion.
- 3. The legal frameworks through which the sanctions were issued.
- 4. The regulations and sanctions regimes that have been instituted against Russia.
- 5. The impact of economic sanctions on Texas, the United States, or other countries.
- 6. The impact of the war or sanctions on the energy industry.
- 7. The legal regimes governing the export of new technologies being deployed in Ukraine.
- 8. International and non-governmental regimes that assist the victims of war.
- 9. The legal regimes related to the Ukrainian and Russian diaspora as a result of the war.
- 10. Best practices for risk mitigation and compliance by energy and technology sector participants within the international sanctions regimes.

Please consider writing an article or asking your colleagues to give it some consideration. The deadline for the submission of articles for the tenth issue is **Tuesday**, **January 31**, **2023**.

All articles submitted should:

- 1. Be between 500 to 2,500 words, although longer copy may be considered;
- 2. Be submitted in MS Word format and double spaced;
- 3. Acknowledge all sources, but keep endnotes to a minimum (use numbers, not numerals);
- 4. Include your name, email address, firm/company affiliation, and city;
- 5. Include a brief synopsis of the article of no more than 50 words;
- 6. Include a short "about the author" summary about you and your practice; and
- 7. Provide an image suggestion using key words or topical direction.
